## CODING MANUAL

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## INTRODUCTION

After data collection, the next phase is to process the data collected. This involves manual coding as well as computer processing.
Coding is basically the process of translating word into numerical codes. This process is necessary so as to facilitate computer processing of data.

It is important to note that therefore, great need of accuracy is called for on the part of all coders in ensuring that only the right codes are entered for the appropriate items and columns.

## I. THE ORGANIZATION OF CODING WORK

Coding organization will be organized as follows:


The work will be done in 2 shifts:
One from 07:00 a.m to 2:00 p.m and other from 2:30 p.m to 09:30 p.m

### 1.1. Coders' duties:

> To code the questionnaires according to the instructions given
$>$ To ensure proper ordering of questionnaires

### 1.2. Verifiers' duties:

> To verify coded questionnaires done by coders
> To distribute the work
> To maintain transmission sheets or registry
$>$ To verify technically the quality of work

### 1.3. Team leaders' duties:

> To verify EAs transmission sheets
> To distribute to verifiers the work
> To receive questionnaires and technical documents from archives
$>$ To ensure that coders in his/her team are producing work of acceptable standard both in quality and quantity (assembly the daily statistics for assessing the work of each person.).
> To prepare the EAs list to be posted to Centrak.
$>$ To ensure good behavior and conduct of each of his/her coders.
> To ensure that uniform solutions to any problems arising during coding are known and used by every coding team.
$>$ To manage the available equipments (materials) to coders under his responsibility
> Provide daily report to the Head coding

### 1.4. Coding Head's duties:

> To be responsible for all census questionnaires coding;
> To ensure that coders and verifiers are performing their job correctly
> To prepare the progress report
> To analyze the progress report and identify the appropriate actions.
> To ensure that Centrack applications is up to date

## II. GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS

### 2.1. All Coders staff should observe the following:

$\checkmark$ Code digits should be clear and readable.
$\checkmark$ Codes should be precise, i.e. extra care should be taken while writing like digits," $0^{\prime \prime}$ written as " 6 " can be mistaken as " 6 " or " 7 " written as " 1 " can be mistaken as digit " 1 "
$\checkmark$ Use red pen during coding. No color other than red should be used for coding.
$\checkmark$ Never change any original entries.
$\checkmark$ Erasing or using correcting fluid (Tippex/blanco) in coding is not allowed. In case of corrections, strike out the wrong code carefully so that it can still be read and write the correct code legibly beside or near the wrong code.
$\checkmark$ Coding should be done within the boxes intended for this purpose. If in doubt you should consult the Coding Supervisor immediately.
$\checkmark$ The coders must be careful to ensure that they are performing their job correctly; otherwise the verifiers who are checking the coders' job will be continuously
pointing out their omission/errors and thus indicating the coders' poor performance which will entail very close supervision by the Team leader.
$\checkmark$ All coded information should be checked in full and corrections made in green ink.
$\checkmark$ In case there is no appropriate code for some information recorded in the documents, coders/verifiers should consult their Team Leaders for their necessary actions.
$\checkmark$ When you are leaving the coding room for lunch or at the end of the day's work, you must ensure that all the EA questionnaires are arranged.
$\checkmark$ The daily work is scheduled from 7:00 to 2:00 p.m for the $1^{\text {st }}$ shift and from 2:30 to 9:30 p.m. for second shift.

### 2.2. Discipline in the workplace

The workplace must be kept clean and always pleasant atmosphere favorable to work. It is strictly forbidden to the group:

- To make noise in coding room (any noise, ring ton, discussions,...)
- To smoke in the coding room;
- To sleep in the coding room;
- To bring food in coding room;
- To take the questionnaires out side of coding room;
- No visitors in coding room.

Any offender (disobedient) liable to severe penalties that could lead to his exclusion. The team leader must ensure that always there is a friendly atmosphere within the team and between members of different teams. However, he must bring order, cleanliness, mutual respect, discipline and rigor at work.

## III: CODING QUESTIONNAIRES

You should strictly follow these instructions and any time you have problems or any doubt, always seek clarification from the Coding Head through your team leader.

## II. HOUSEHOLD SUMMARY TABLE

The coder will make sure that the sum of the members of the household indicated in the summary table corresponds to the listed number of members of household. $\mathrm{He} /$ she should also check that the given results related to present resident, absent resident and visitors are matching with P06 in the questionnaire. The resident above 18 years old should be also checked in P05 (age).
